Dear students and parents/guardians:

The following are the policies/guidelines/expectations for World History II. These signed guidelines will serve as a contract between you and the teacher of this course. In order to be successful in this course, you must follow these guidelines.

WHY?

In today's interconnected diverse world, students must be prepared to interact with people of all cultures. This class will expose students to historical and current events which have shaped the modern world. Students must also study how society works which will empower them to become well-informed good citizens who will participate and better society. Students will learn important life skills such as critical thinking, writing, collaborating, debating, presenting, and public speaking. History is what made the world the way it is today. Learning about history is what makes it possible to learn from the past and plan for the future.

HOW?

Grade 10 provides a snapshot of the world circa 1750. The course continues chronologically up to the present. Several concepts are woven throughout the course including industrialization, nationalism, imperialism, conflict, technology, human rights, current global issues, and the interconnectedness of the world. We will use a set of different skills which will require students to think critically, read and analyze sources, write well thought-out responses, and conduct and present research-based projects. There will be a Regents Exam at the conclusion of the Spring semester and will include content covered throughout the entire year.
