	Creativity: *Presentation must be a unique, original, interesting, and entertaining version of the subject matter *Presentation is engaging, stimulating, and captures the interest of the audience *Presentation must allow for an element of interactivity between you and the class (i.e. questions, discussion, debate)	
	Content: *Presentation covers topic in a clear, appropriate, and accurate manner *Multiple perspectives, bias, prediction, and impacts are explained	
	Delivery: *Student is eloquent and shows enthusiasm for the subject *Use of appropriate volume and rate of speech. Pronounces words clearly and can easily be heard	
	Timing: Presentation should be 8-10 minutes
